RESERVATIONS POLICY

Reservations are needed, so please call in advance. We don't normally need a lot of notice- many of our reservations are made within 48 hours of the trip. Please plan to arrive at the meeting site 20 minutes prior to the departure. A credit card guarantee is required with each reservation. A 50% charge will be made for cancellations made within 24 hours of the departure. A 25% rescheduling fee will be applied for trips rescheduled within 24 hours of the departure.

- Have a change of clothes in your car for after the trip

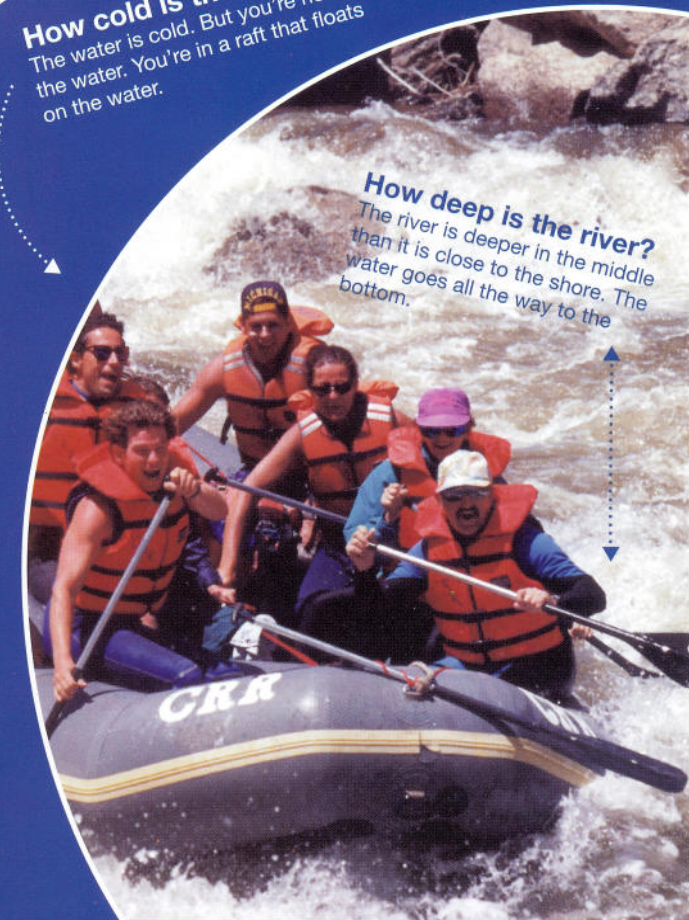

RIVER RAFTING



How cold is the water?
 The water is cold. But you're not in the water. You're in a raft that floats on the water.

How deep is the river?
 The river is deeper in the middle than it is close to the shore. The water goes all the way to the bottom.



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COLORADO RIVER

Recommended for beginners and families with children, the Colorado River offers deep canyons, spectacular vistas, and easy rapids. More than a float, but without heavy whitewater, our Colorado River raft trip has the right balance of atmosphere and fun in an isolated setting.

Even in light rapids, we pay close attention to safety. Everyone wears a Coast Guard approved life jacket and a safety briefing is given before each trip. You do get wet, so we suggest wearing shorts and a t-shirt. Appropriate footwear is required. Have dry clothes in your car for after the trip. Snacks and beverages are permitted.



EAGLE RIVER

Get ready to get wet! Fed by the runoff and available in May, June, and early July, the Eagle River has some of the best rapids in Colorado. Great rapids and great scenery make the Eagle a great whitewater outing.

As always, we pay close attention to safety. Everyone wears a life jacket and wetsuit and a thorough briefing on whitewater procedures is given prior to each trip. Under the wetsuit, most people wear a swimsuit but shorts are okay. Wetsuit boots are provided. Have a warm set of clothes in the car for after the trip.

DIRECTIONS TO OUR COLORADO RIVER MEETING SITE IN RADIUM:

From Vail / Avon / Beaver Creek:
I-70 west to Wolcott (Exit 157- 20 miles west of Vail). Highway 131 North for 14 miles to State Bridge. Cross the bridge and turn right on the Trough Road. 9.5 miles to the Radium Road. Turn left and it's 2.5 miles to our headquarters in Radium. Allow 1 hour from Vail.

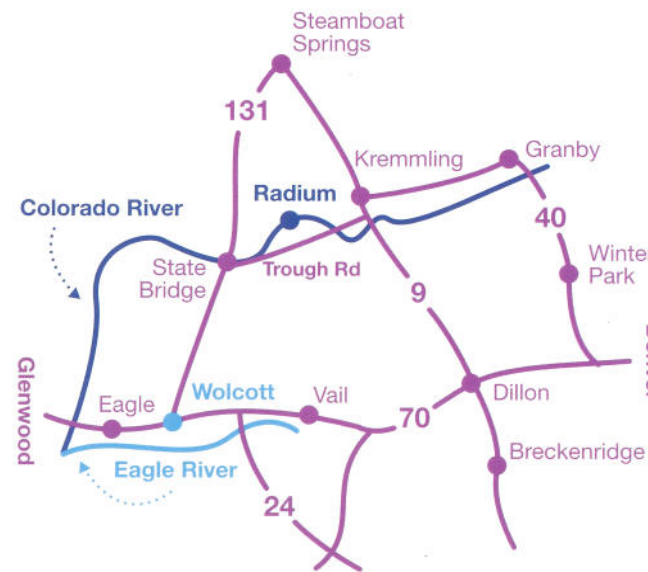
From Breckenridge / Frisco / Summit County:
Highway 9 north from Silverthorne for 36 miles to the Trough Road. Turn left for 14 miles to the Radium Road. Turn right and it's 2.5 miles to our headquarters in Radium. Allow 90 minutes from Breckenridge.

From Winter Park / Granby / Grand County:
Highway 40 west to Kremmling. Turn left on Highway 9 for 2 miles to the Trough Road. Turn right for 14 miles to the Radium Road. Turn right and it's 2.5 miles to our headquarters in Radium. Allow 90 minutes from Winter Park.

From Steamboat Springs:
Highway 40 east to Kremmling. Turn right on Highway 9 for 2 miles to the Trough Road. Turn right for 14 miles to the Radium Road. Turn right and it's 2.5 miles to our headquarters in Radium. Allow 90 minutes from Steamboat Springs.

Inflatable Kayaks (Duckies)

We have the two person inflatable kayaks called duckies. These are a great alternative for the more active and adventurous members of your party. The duckies accompany the raft trip, so our guides are always nearby to ensure safety. Duckies are a lot wetter, involve more effort, and allow more freedom to our more rambunctious guests. Available on the Colorado River only.

From Vail / Summit County / Denver:
Take I-70 West to Wolcott (exit 157, 20 miles west of Vail). Take the exit and turn right to Hwy. 6. Turn left and it's 1/2 mile to the Wolcott Yacht Club on the left.

From Steamboat Springs:
Follow Hwy. 131 South for 75 miles to Wolcott. The Wolcott Yacht Club is directly across Hwy. 6.
